

DETOX GUIDELINES

Meet at:

130 Industrial Drive

Greenville, SC 29607

Phoenix Center is a 16 bed facility.

10 beds for 3-7 day detox, and 6 beds for a 2-4 week residential program.

Entrance is located on the back left side of the building (look for the **orange awning**).

- DETOX requests the primary attendant be an active home group member, take the lead of the meeting and have 6 months continuous sobriety. 90 days required for any other attendee
- At this time we suggest no more than 5 home group members to facilitate an AA meeting at the Phoenix Detox Center
- If your Home Group's committed time slot is not going to be covered, please call the Nurses' Station prior to 6:15 on the assigned day at (864) 467-3770
- Plan to meet your partner(s) outside at 6:15
- Wait for entire group to arrive before alerting the Nurses' Station
- Ring the buzzer to get through the 1st door-tell them you are there for the AA meeting
- Buzz for the elevator between 6:15 and 6:25 -- this is important as the center has a strict schedule for the clients
- Buzz at 2nd floor door for access to Nurses' Station
- Sign in on the white visitors' book at the Nurses' Station on the form provided. Ask for the book if not presented with it. Please use the following format: Date, Group Name, checkmark ✓ in the "AA" column, number of people in your group
Example: 4-1-24, Ebony, ✓, 4
- Please do **NOT** sign in with your individual name -- **ONLY** indicate **GROUP NAME**
- Ask for the orange binder if not handed to you; this is the AA meeting guide (any other binder is not AA)
- Be certain to follow the meeting guide (upstateintergroup.org/detox-meetings/) all the way through to the end as that is where the orange chip for obtaining a free Big Book is addressed. The orange chip is valid only at AA meetings in the Greater Greenville Area
- If no orange chips are in the orange binder, there should be extras at the Nurses' Station, if not please call/text JudiiF 973-876-2955
